

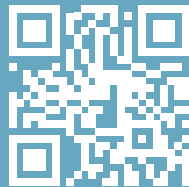


Who We Are

Improving care. Changing lives.

Does your child have problems in school or struggle with social and emotional regulation?

Have you noticed any concerning changes in your child's behavior, learning, or daily functioning?

Has your child suffered from a brain injury that is affecting their day-to-day functioning?

Do you have concerns that your child may have a developmental disorder, such as autism or Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, a neuropsychological assessment may be right for your child!

What is a Neuropsychological Evaluation?

A neuropsychological evaluation is aimed at helping you understand how your child's learning and behavior is associated with brain functioning. This is done by formally testing your child's skills and abilities in a variety of intellectual, memory, attention, academic, emotional, and behavioral domains.

How We Help

A neuropsychological assessment provides information to assist in pinpointing these problems and identifying your child's profile of strengths and weaknesses. This information is then summarized and recommendations are provided to assist with developing a plan for your child and family that addresses these specific needs.



How do neuropsychological assessments differ from school assessments and from general assessments at CET?

School assessments typically determine IF a student is eligible for special education programs and are primarily conducted by the school. They focus on skills needed for academic success. Typically, school assessments do not diagnose disorders nor provide comprehensive recommendations for a child outside of an academic setting. Neuropsychological assessments focus on understanding WHY a child is having difficulties in school or home and are generally more in-depth and broader than general assessments. Neuropsychological evaluations assess intelligence, motor skills, visual-spatial relations, attention, memory, executive functions and learning/academic achievement, as well as emotional and behavior functioning.

What we assess

- General intelligence
- Learning and memory
- Visual-spatial skills
- Language
- Attention
- Executive skills (such as organization, flexibility, and planning)
- Academic achievement skills (such as reading and math)
- Sensorimotor skills
- Behavior and emotional functioning
- Social skills

Get Started

1. Visit bakercenter.org/cet to schedule a free informational phone call at a time that is convenient for you. Our staff will answer your questions and schedule an assessment for your child.
2. During the assessment, we get to know you and your child and learn about the issues and concerns you are facing.
3. After the assessment, we provide detailed feedback and recommendations about next steps to support your child. These recommendations can include consultation, school-based interventions, and treatment.

Payment & Insurance

- We accept **Blue Cross Blue Shield, Tufts Health Public Plans, Tufts Commercial, and Harvard Pilgrim** insurance. Coverage varies by insurance plans, and we will verify your coverage. We also encourage families to check with their insurance company to understand their covered benefits.
- Private pay clients will be billed at a standard bundled rate.
- For private pay clients who may be eligible for out-of-network insurance reimbursement, we can provide itemized receipts for you to submit claims to your insurance.
